WHATS NEW IN NEVADA ELECTIONS

*Automatic Voter Registration at the Nevada DMV - During your transaction with the Nevada DMV, you will be automatically registered to vote, unless you choose to opt out of registration. Registration and Updates processed through the DMV must abide by the Standard Registration Deadline, October 6, 2020.

Mail/Absentee Ballot All active registered voters will receive a mail ballot for the 2020 General Election. All voted mail ballots must be dropped off or mailed by Election Day. Mail ballot return envelopes must be postmarked on or before Election Day and received by the Election Department on or before the seventh day after Election Day. If you decide to vote in-person instead of by mail, you will need to do one of the following:

- Surrender your mail ballot (preferably in the packet sent to you) to an election official at the voting site.
- If you do not surrender your ballot, you will sign an affirmation at the voting site swearing that you have not already voted in the current election and that you understand no one may attempt to vote or actually vote more than once in the same election.

Restoration of Right to Vote law has changed for Nevada residents with felony convictions in Nevada or in any other state who are currently not in prison. They are now allowed to immediately register to vote. This also applies to persons whose voter registration had been previously cancelled because of a felony conviction and to persons who are currently on probation or parole. No special procedures or paperwork are required. Such persons need only follow the standard procedures for voter registration and must also satisfy the standard voter registration eligibility requirements.

<u>Provisional Voting</u> will now include a full ballot, regardless of the reason for casting a provisional ballot. This means they will contain all offices, candidates, and questions that would be on a regular ballot for the voter's precinct. After an election, the Secretary of State will establish a system, such as a website or toll-free number, to inform voters of provisional status.

REGISTRATION DEADLINES

Standard Close of Registration, Tuesday, October 6, 2020 - Close of Mail-In, DMV voter registration/updates and In-Person Standard Registration: Last day to register to vote or to update your existing registration by mail or in-person at the Election Department.

Online Close of Registration, Tuesday, October 7 - 15, 2020 – Last day to register online through the Secretary of State's Website at www.RegistertoVoteNV.gov.

Same Day Registration Period* – Voters that register during this period will be required to present an unexpired Nevada Driver's License or Identification Card issued by the DMV. If you are already registered and you update your record during this period, you do not have to present ID. See our website for more information regarding Same Day Registration requirements at www.clarkcountynv.gov/vote. Same Day Registration will be available at any Clark County Election Day Vote Center or at any early voting site. For online registration/updates go to www.RegistertoVoteNV.gov.

EARLY VOTING AND ELECTION DAY FOR THE NOVEMBER 3, 2020 GENERAL ELECTION

EARLY VOTING begins October 17th and ends on October 30, 2020 with various hours and locations. All early voting locations serve as drop off locations for further convenience.

ELECTION DAY is Tuesday, November 3, 2020 from 7am to 7pm.

MAIL BALLOT DROP OFF LOCATIONS will be available starting September 28, 2020 at various locations. Locations will be included in the mail ballot packet that will be mailed to each active voter.

U. S. Armed Force Members and Family FPCA Deadline

Tuesday, October 27, 2020 – 5:00 p.m.

Nevada's Effective Absentee System for Elections, or EASE, is an online application that seamlessly integrates voter registration and electronic ballot delivery and marking. EASE is available to members of the United States Armed Forces, their spouses and dependents, and Nevada voters who reside outside of the country. FPCA voters must provide the following information in order for the request to be processed.

What we need in order to process the FPCA:

- Address last domiciled before leaving the US (per block -1 and 2 of the FPCA)
- Where you are now (per block 3 of the FPCA)






Electronic Sample Ballot For Upcoming Elections

How to Submit a Request: You now have the option of receiving an electronic sample ballot by e-mail instead of a paper one by postal mail, but you MUST submit an online request. Log in to Registered Voter Services. Then, select Request My Sample Ballot Electronically (Go Green) from the Voter Services dropdown menu at the top of the page, enter your e-mail address, and click "Save." You will immediately receive a confirmation e-mail indicating that you will no longer receive paper sample ballots. If you do not receive the confirmation, check your spam or junk mail folder first before you contact us. Regular sample ballots will be mailed starting a week before early voting begins. A sample of your ballot will be available by logging into to Registered Voter Services at www.ClarkCountyNV.gov/vote.

Digitally preview your mail and manage your packages scheduled to arrive soon! Informed Delivery allows you to view greyscale images of the exterior, address side of letter-sized mailpieces and track packages in one convenient location. You can check the delivery of your mail ballot with this easy to use service.
