Why are we here today? Ballot Question 3 Summary

- Ballot Question 3
 - Top of the Ballot Races
 - Open primary
 - Match the down ballot races
 - Top 5 candidates move forward
 - Wider range of candidates
 - More choices for voters
 - Ranked Choice Voting General Election
 - 5 Candidates Creates a spoiler effect
 - RCV is an instant runoff
 - Candidates must have 50%1 votes to win

- Opposition: RCV is too confusing
 - RCV is new
 - Voter education addresses newness
 - So, Vote Nevada is providing education on ranked choice voting
 - Everyone can learn with practice
 - We are here to practice

Ballot Question 3 Primary Election Process

- Top of the ticket races
 - U.S. Senate
 - House of Representatives
 - Constitutional offices
 - Legislature
 - Assembly
 - Senate
 - Open primary
 - All candidates together
 - No voters prohibited from voting
 - Matches down-ballot races

- Primary Election
 - All candidates on the same ballot
 - Party affiliation included
 - Voters pick one candidate
 - Top 5 candidates move forward

Ballot Question 3 General Election Process

- General Election
 - Five Candidates
 - Voters Options
 - Traditional: One and Done
 - Rank up to 5
 - Blank columns counted as none of these candidates
 - Ranking allows for an instant runoff
 - One and Done
 - As long as your candidate does not drop off in the instant runoff due to having the least number of votes, your vote counts in the instant run off


- Ranked Choice Voting Tabulation:
- First tabulation, if a candidate gets 50%+1, winner!
- If no candidate receives 50%+1, instant runoff
- Candidate with fewest votes drops off, that person's voters' second choice votes transfer to their second-choice candidate

2022 Alaska Ranked Choice Vote Count




